James Copp Has Narrow
Escape - Two Other Blazes
Call Out Department.
Going to sleep with a lighted
cigarette in his hand nearly cost James
Copp, an occupant of one of the Warner
Rooms in Hill St., his life yesterday.
At least, he's "out" one suit
of clothes, which was lying on a chair
next to his bed, when the cigarette
ignited them.

Smoke that choked him aroused
him from sound slumber, to find his
clothes in flames, and the rug be-
neath the chair smoldering. The
Fire Department answered his sum-
mons for aid, and made little work
of stopping the fire in its infancy.
The burned suit of clothes, the seat
of the chair, and the rug beneath
formed the extent of the damage
done. A fire of larger proportions
would have been a real fire hazard,
according to Chief Frank B. Hugh-
son.

A small fire in the blower pipe of
the tempering room of the Henry &
Allen Forge Shop called the Fire
Department to the scene this morn-
ing at 8 o'clock. Workmen had the
fire practically out when the firemen
arrived. This is the second or third
time this year that the blower pipe
has caused the same trouble.

The firemen were given a long run
up the Parkway to a burning Ford
truck just outside the city limits Sat-
urday afternoon. The truck had
been pushed to the side of the road
and apparently abandoned. The cap
and steering wheel were burning mer-
cifully, while the rest of the machine
remained cool. Cause for the fire was
given as combustion of the gasoline fumes
from an open gasoline tank by igni-
tion wires. The truck bore the
name of M. P. Belknap, Skaneateles.
A spare tire and a tool kit were taken
by the firemen to Police Head-
quarters awaiting the owner, who
has not yet called to identify his
property.
