GYPSIES STEAL \$20 AND SHERIFF TAKES NIGHT RIDE

Money Is Returned and Nomads Hastened On Their Way Outside County.

The first run-in between the authorities of Cayuga County and traveling bands of gypsies for the season of 1923 developed last night when Sheriff Fay Teeter received word from Mapleton that Edward Perkins who resides near that place had been "gypped" of a fine and dandy \$20 bill by one of the black-eyed and smooth women of the gypsies traveling south in a motor caravan of a half dozen cars.

Perkins stated that, as he was walking home along the highway from the Pease department store at Mapleton, one of the cars in the caravan stopped.

On the top of the purse contents rested the crisp bill. He removed it and was digging down into the purse for a dime when the woman grabbed the bill, leaped into the car and away went the caravan on high.

According to Perkins, \$20 bills root high. They don't grow on bushes along the town line between Fleming and Scripps.

Perkins was unable to identify the woman who snatched his bill and all of the band professed innocence of any theft.

Sheriff Teeter resorted to diplomacy without getting very far and progress was not made until he held up the big chief, flashed the pretty gold badge given him by his deputies at the beginning of the year, and curtly stated that unless the fifth of a century in currency was not forthcoming he would have to take the whole bunch back to Mapleton.

This threat brought results. The members of the party dug down in their jeans.

Mr. Perkins was given his money, Cayuga County was rid of the gypsies and everybody but the nomads satisfied. No arrests were made.
