WHO, OR WHAT IS RESPONSIBLE?

WATER BOARD INSPECTION.

The Board does not explain why it has tolerated conditions that it could have prevented; it does not explain why it was ignorant of flagrant violations of the law; it does not explain why, after the local Health Board, the State Board of Health, reputable local physicians and business men, and the Citizen, had all found, and pointed out intolerable conditions due to lax inspection of the water shed—the Water Board absolutely denied the existence of such conditions.

THE UPPER PUMP HOUSE.

The Board insists that both the retention and enlargement of the upper pump house were proper. "No competent engineer can be found, we believe, who will, after a study of the situation, advise the present building of a gravity system and the doing away with and scrapping of the valuable property now in existence."

DELIBERATE MISSTATEMENT BY THE BOARD.

The Water Board holds that Mr. Skinner, who, at Mr. Osborne's "invitation," estimated the cost of a gravity system, under-estimated the length of the needed conduit, not knowing what the distance between the pump houses really is.
