VALUE IS NOT KNOWN.

Bankrupt's Trustee Has Two Life Insurance Policies the Worth of Which is a Mystery--Proceedings Adjourned.

The matter of the confirmation of the report of Nelson L. Drummond as trustee in the matter of the bankruptcy of General C. D. MacDougal came before Referee in Bankruptcy Elder again, this morning, but at the request of J. Henry Kerr, attorney for the trustee, an adjournment of a week was taken. Mr. Kerr as attorney for the trustee sold certain securities at the Court house, included in these were two life insurance policies, one of \$10,000 on the life of N. G. Green and the other of \$2,000 on the life of H. L. Seifick, both of which had been assigned to General MacDougal. It was known about these policies or their values and when the report of the trustee was submitted to Referee Elder, after he and the attorneys had consulted about the matter, it was deemed best to hold the matter open. This was done in the hope that further information might be secured about the value of the policies. When the matter came up this morning, this information had not been secured and so a further adjournment was taken.

WALL STREET GOSSIP.

Wall Street, New York, July 18--The opening dealings in stocks were unimportant and included only a very sluggish price movement. Gains were the more numerous but there was a sufficient sprinkling of declines to give a slightly irregular tone to the market. People's Gas rose 1/8. The sharp fall in prices of stocks during the morning resulted from only moderate selling. The stagnation of the demand discouraged holders for a rise and prompted an attack by an opposing speculative party. The reported shading of steel prices and dissatisfaction with the copper trade position were elements in the weakness of the market. The general list showed numerous losses of 1 to 1/2. Heading fell 3/4. Union Pacific 2 1/2, American Steel Foundries 2 1/2, Wash preferred and Amalgamated Copper 2, United States Steel 1 1/2 and Southern Pacific, Louisville, Nashville and Brooklyn Transit 1 1/2. Railroads through the market into July and prices yielded again. Bonds were irregular.
